CANADA POST & CUPW

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) and Canada Post are still in heated negotiations. There is no guarantee that the two parties will be able to settle their ongoing negotiation, and currently, CUPW has banned all overtime for their members.

RATE REDUCTIONS

With Canada's tax deadline passed, resident should have received their 2024 Notice of Assessment.

Please note that if your loved one is currently benefiting from a Rate Reduction, they must renew their rate as of July 1st.

This process requires the most recent NOA, and a completed Rate Reduction Application. Rate Reduction applications will begin processing on June 16th.

Electrical rough-ins are underway on the third and fourth floors, and fire spray should be completed early in June throughout the building.
